68 Odd records set

A total of 68 Mountain Home Odd-Ball Antics swim meet records were broken Saturday at the second annual swimming of the event. Although swimmers in different age categories competed at the same time, their times were applied only to those in their age group. In many instances, there was only one person in each age-/gender group, but most races were won in times better than those established last year.

For women 18-24, Sandra Welborn won the 50-meter freestyle and the 100-individual medley; Teresa Jones won the 25-backstroke and the 25-butterfly; Leslie Kunath won the 25-and 50-

breastroke.

Women 30-34: Vickey Flow won the 25-freestyle and backstroke and Pat Hendershott was second in the 25-freestyle.

Women 35-39: Hope Vowell won the 25-freestyle, 50-freestyle, 100freestyle, 400-freestyle, 25backstroke, 50-backstroke, 25-butterfly, 50-butterfly and 100individual medley. Only in the 100freestyle did she fail to establish a new record.

Women 40-44: Ida Hlavacek competed in the same nine events, winning them all in record times.

Women 45-49: Salley Moore set records in the 25-freestyle, 25breaststroke, 50-breaststroke, 100breaststroke and 200-breaststroke.

Women 65-69: Laverne Ander-

son established records in six events, the 25-backstroke, 50backstroke. 25-breaststroke. 50breaststroke, 100-breaststroke and 200-breaststroke.

The most competition during the day was for men 18-24. Results were as follows: 25-freestyle, Matt Wilson, Bruce Wilson; 50freestyle, M. Wilson, B. Wilson, Robert Loar; 100-freestyle, Loar, Jimmie Vowell swam exhibition; 25-backstroke, M. Wilson, B. Wilson; 25-breaststroke, John Schmuecker, M. Wilson; B. Wilson; 50-breaststroke Schmuecker, B. Wilson, Loar; 100-breaststroke, Schmuecker, Loar; 25-butterfly, M. Wilson.

Men 65-69: A.E. Peschell set records in the 25-freestyle, 50freestyle, 100-freestyle, 25 backstroke, 50-backstroke, 25breaststroke, 25-butterfly and 100individual medley.

In the women 18-24 100-medley relay, Wlborn, Kunath, Kunath and Jones swam a 1:15.86.

In the men's 18-24 division, Wilson, Wilson, Schmuecker and Loard beat J. Vowell, Flow, Falmler and Peschell.

In the mixed 100-medley relay, Jones, M. Wilson, Schmuecker and Welborn beat Kunath, Kunath, B. Wilson and Loar.

In the mixed 18-24 freestyle realy, M. Wilson, B. Wilson, Stone and Kunath edged Schmuecker, Kunath, Jones and Loar by .23 seconds.

Bank, Hlavacek, Rawn and Lensini swam the mixed 35 and over 100-medley relay in 108.59. Bank, Hlavacek, Lensini and Flowswam the fastest of any 100-reay of the day, a 1:00.57 freestyle.

H. Vowell, T. Vowell, J. Vowell and Falmler swam an exhibition

100-freestyle in 108.69.
